



Subject: Stock-tacking of FP7 funded research activities

Under the 7th Framework Programme a dedicated programme for the Social Sciences and Humanities provided over 600 million euros of funding for research covering a wide range of topics, resulting in over 250 projects. The research findings arising from these initiatives have been periodically collected, synthesized, screened and used for providing policy recommendations. At the same time, the messages generated by the projects have been feeding new research agendas both within FP7 and towards Horizon 2020.

The research areas tackled under FP7 can be grouped into the following 9 major clusters:

1. **Knowledge-based economy and social innovation:** covering research on innovation, competitiveness, intangible capital as a competitive asset and its contribution to productivity; internationalization of innovation in the EU and its impact on the business sector and the EU innovation policy; social innovation and its economic underpinnings, emerging patterns, service sector innovation and implications for policy as well as new indicators for measuring new social and economic realities for informed policy-making;
2. **Macroeconomic policies and growth:** tackling research on financial systems, public finances, role of public and private services for EU growth and the public sector of the future;
3. **Employment and labour market:** addressing work and life quality; the future European labour market; overcoming youth unemployment.
4. **Social inequalities, education and social inclusion:** addressing social inclusion, poverty, education and care, families and family policies, work and life quality, migration, gender;
5. **Demographic change:** studying ageing, longevity, societal trends and evolving lifestyles, welfare policies;
6. **Sustainable socio-economic development:** tackling socio-ecological transition, foresight studies, post-carbon societies, sustainable urban development, social cohesion, corporate social responsibility, climate change and energy security;
7. **Europe as a Global Actor:** supporting research on the multipolar world with its economic, social and political developments and the role of Europe in this context; interactions and interdependences between world regions and their implications; global governance, conflicts peace and human rights and Europe's changing role in the world; international collaboration with Canada, the US, Latin America and Caribbean, the Pacific, China, India and other world regions have been developed;
8. **Democracy, participation & citizenship:** covering topics on democratic ownership and participation; citizenship; European integration; rule of law and justice; human rights; surveillance; citizen's resilience;

9. **Diversities and commonalities in Europe:** tackling European identities; conflicts; cultural heritage; multilingualism; religions; arts & history; museums and digital networks;

The research developed within these areas has been reviewed and showcased through clustered policy publications as well as presented at targeted events. In both cases the debates generated gave rise to potential and additional future research scenarios and possible paths to be further explored throughout Horizon 2020.

Here below a stocktaking of relevant publications and resources pertaining to the above mentioned clusters is presented as an orientation for further analysis of results and lessons learnt through FP7 Theme 8 – Socio-economic Sciences and Humanities.
